The Hymn, “Just As I Am” was written by Charlotte Elliott of Brighton, England, in 1836. Her health was broken and she was angry and bitter. In 1822, she asked a visiting Swiss minister, “If I wanted to become a Christian and to share the peace and joy you possess, what would I do?” He answered, “You would give yourself to God just as you are now, with your fightings and fears, hates and loves, pride and shame.” She asked, “I would come to God just as I am?” Years later, Charlotte wrote a poem which has since become the most famous and beloved invitational hymn in history, “Just As I Am”.
