Breathe on Me, Breath of God was written by Edwin Hatch, an Anglican priest, in 1878. It was originally called “Spiritus Deo” (Spirit of God”) and was published as a hymn in 1886. In 1937 a Southern Baptist hymn-writer rewrote the stanzas.

The hymn is based on John 20:21-22 when Jesus said to His disciples “Peace to you! As the Father has sent me, I also send you. And when He said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit.’”
